Databases and Journal Articles

Alverno subscribes to some great databases! From the Alverno Library’s homepage, click “**Databases by Subject**” and select “**Nursing & Allied Health**”. These quality databases offer access to scholarly journal articles and guidelines that will help you understand the needs of vulnerable populations.

- Cochrane Library
- ProQuest Nursing (look for the Cultural Competency Briefs on the right side of the page)

Tip: Remember to use synonyms when searching for information on cultures. For example, these search terms all represent related ethnic groups: Hispanics, Hispanic Americans, Latinos, and Mexican Americans.
